The first ever World Radiosport Team Championship was declared a success by competitors, participants and interested observers from all over the world. For the first time, competitors were all located in the same geographic area and had no traditional advantages such as rare callsign, equatorial propagation or station/hardware superiority. In fact, all WRTC competing teams used similar moderate antennas and 100 watts. Twenty-two teams from fifteen different countries gathered in Seattle, Washington, to promote goodwill as well as compete.

The brainchild of Danny Eskenazi, K7SS, the event was planned to coincide with and be a part of the 1990 Goodwill Games. The Committee and the competitors all held their breaths as the contest started hoping that there would be enough stations for the teams to contact to make the contest interesting. We were overwhelmed by the response and activity! The whole world turned out for what was arguably the amateur radio contesting event of the decade. With the winning team working over 1300 stations

and achieving an average rate for ten hours of 130 contacts per hour, there was plenty of activity for everyone. Forty meters at the end of the contest produced the highest rates and biggest pileups. With the exception of the RF curtain to Asia, the contest produced activity around the world.

With the contest being held in the middle of the world's second largest ham population, it comes as no surprise that U.S. stations took most of the single-operator honors with congratulations to HA0DU for breaking the Top Ten. Top honors go to Steve, N2IC/0, for turning in the top score with 3.1 meg points and sweeping first place with NG8D coming in second and K1TO placing third.

The multi-operator, single transmitter category results reflected more DX stations in the results with 4 Soviet stations in the Top Ten. Congratulations to the crew at K8AZ for their terrific 3.3 meg effort. Also from W8-land, KW8N came in second with HG5A placing third.

In the multi-operator, multi-transmitter category, the winning team at NX1H won with 1.7 meg points, LY2ZO was second and N2KW placed third.

The Committee received 944 total logs vying for awards and prizes and is happy to announce that 198 pins (for 30 WRTC contacts) will be awarded and 762 certificates (for 5 WRTC contacts) will be awarded in addition to the 500 T-shirts. The 500th score was 67,039 points and scores submitted higher than that will receive the coveted T-shirts. By the way, T-shirts will be awarded one per station. This is consistent with awards from other contests. Due to financial limitations, we are unable to award T-shirts to all multi-operators but they will receive pins and certificates when eligible.


